PINE LAKE WEED TREATMENT

The treatment of Pine Lake for Eurasian Milfoil is scheduled for: Thursday, June 22nd, 2017

The chemicals will not be applied if the applicators feel conditions are unsafe, such as storms, heavy rain or high winds. We have allowed June 23rd as a rain date. If conditions still do not allow treatment, you will be notified.

Should you not want this treatment, please notify the Village Hall as soon as possible prior to this date. Please call us even if you already have a standing No Spray Request. You have until Wednesday June 21st at 4:30 P.M. to notify the Village of Chenequa

Forestry Update

This is the time of year to start looking to your trees for things that may appear out of the ordinary. Chenequa is certainly not immune to attacks from outside pests and it takes a joint effort to tackle these problems before they become a serious threat

So far in 2017 have identified:

- Emerald Ash Borer
- Eastern Sawfly
- Eastern Tent caterpillars
- Jumping Worms
- Gypsy moth
- Wooly Beach Aphid
- Diplopia
- Rhizosphere needle cast
- Dutch Elm Disease
- Cedar Apple rust
- Maple Gall Mites
- Oak Wilt

As the year progresses, we will likely discover new forest pests and diseases. We urge residents to report obscurities with their trees and shrubs.
