Boating

Anyone born on or after 1/1/1989 is required to complete a boating safety course to legally operate a motorized boat or personal watercraft on Wisconsin waters.

DNR recreational safety specialists recommend all boat operators complete a safety course though.

- ➤ Personal Flotation Devices (PFD): are required for every person on a vessel; including paddle boards, canoes, and kayaks.
- ➤ If your boat has a lanyard, please attach to PFD.
- ➤ Boats with built-in fuel tanks must have a fire extinguisher on board.
- ➤ Personal watercraft must operate at slow-no-wake when within 200 ft. of the shore.
- ➤ Make sure boat registration is current, certificate of number is carried on board, and navigational lights are in working order.
