## Police Updates



### Lake Country Citizen Academy

We invite you to apply and join us in learning about the local Lake Country police departments and fire department for Citizens Academy. Lake Country Citizens Academy is put on by the Village of Chenequa, City of Delafield, Village of Hartland, and Village of Pewaukee Police Departments, along with Lake Country Fire / EMS Department and Waukesha County Communications, which is our dispatch center.

This is for citizens or those who work in this area who would like to learn about what the local police departments do. There are no physical requirements. Lake Country Citizen Academy is provided as a means to reach out to our community and educate the public about the law enforcement profession. There is no cost to attend the academy. Attendees must be at least 18 years old, have no criminal record, and a valid driver's license (if you would like to drive the squad cars).

## Forestry Updates



Just a reminder that as always, no cutting of trees, brush, or any vegetation is allowed within 75' of a waterway in the Village without a permit. The purpose of this is to prevent erosion, filter runoff before it goes to the water, maintain a healthy aquatic ecosystem, and preserve the natural beauty of all the shorelines.

The Village of Chenequa employs two foresters that would be more than happy to meet with any resident on site to help out with any tree-related questions that anyone may have.
