

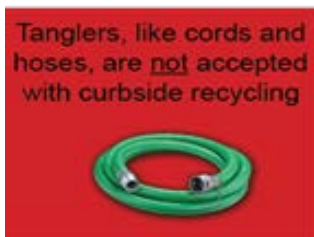

## Forestry Updates



Daily forestry operations generate wood chips. The chips vary in quality depending on the type of brush or small logs which are ground up. These chips are available to residents intermittently.

## Police Updates



Please remember to practice safe boating on our beautiful lakes this summer by making sure you have your proper Personal Flotation Devices (PFD). All vessels, including canoes, kayaks, and paddleboards, must have at least one (1) USCG- approved **Wearable PFD** for each person on board. **Besides being USCG-approved, all PFD's must be:**

- 1. In good & serviceable condition**, which means no tears, rips, broken straps or snaps.
- 2. Readily accessible**, which means you are able to put the PFD on quickly in an emergency.
- 3. Of proper size for the intended wearer**, Sizing for PFD's is based on body weight and chest size.

All vessels 16 feet or more in length (except canoes, kayaks, and paddleboards) must have one (1) USCG-approved **Throwable PFD** on board that is immediately accessible. Every person on board a personal watercraft must **wear** a USCG-approved Type I, II, III, or V PFD.

High Water Conditions requiring SNW restrictions for Pine Lake, Beaver Lake, and North Lake will be posted on the Village of Chenequa website and Legal Board.
