As many of you are aware the vaccine for the Coronavirus (COVID-19) has already begun distribution in the United States including right here in the State of Wisconsin. While this is certainly a positive step towards a long term cure for this pandemic, criminals are also trying to capitalize on this news as well. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Inspector General, has warned that scammers are offering, COVID-19 vaccines, COVID-19 tests, HHS grants, and Medicare prescription cards in exchange for personal or banking information, to include Medicare information. All of these services being offered are SCAMS.

Here are some tips:

- Government officials will not contact you in this way or ask you for money.
- Medicare beneficiaries should be cautious of unsolicited requests for personal information.
- Do not respond to calls, voicemails, emails, texts and don't click hyperlinks. If you are contacted, don't fall for it! The scammers can be very persuasive, bold, and aggressive.
- If you suspect COVID-19 health care fraud, report it immediately online or call 1-800-HHS-TIPS (1-800-447-8477).

The personal information collected by scammers can be used to fraudulently bill federal healthcare programs, draw on personal bank accounts and commit medical identity theft. Please be vigilant when it comes to these scams that will most likely come via telephone or email. If you feel like you are a victim of a crime, please contact the Chenequa Police Department for assistance.
