Police Department News

With tax season in full swing, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) state tax agencies and tax industry warn tax professionals of new email scams that attempt to steal their tax software preparation credentials. The latest phishing email uses the IRS logo and a variety of subject lines such as "Action Required: Your account has now been put on hold." The IRS has observed similar bogus emails that claim to be from a "tax preparation application provider." One such variation offers an "unusual activity report" and a solution link for the recipient to restore their account.

Tax professionals who get scam emails should save the email as a file and then send it as an attachment to phishing@irs.gov. They should also notify the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration at www.tigta.gov to report the IRS Impersonation Scam.
