Commendable Act by a Citizen Award...

In the early morning hours on January 8, 2023, Ms. Schroeder was driving her vehicle in the area when she came upon an elderly female in the roadway in 25 degrees Fahrenheit and it was very dark out. Ms. Schroeder did the "right" thing and pulled over and made contact with the elderly female. She was able to recognize that something was not right and asked the elderly female if she could help her get warm. The elderly female agreed to get in Ms. Schroeder's vehicle to get warm. Ms. Schroeder then called the Police to try and get some help for the elderly female.

With the help of Dispatch, she was able to locate the elderly female's address and we were able to get her home to her husband, who was unaware that she had left the house. He confirmed that his wife had memory issues and they were starting the process of getting her help.

Ms. Schroeder's calming demeanor and caring personality helped put the elderly female at ease in this very stressful situation.

Therefore, the Village of Chenequa Police Department nominated her for the Commendable Act by a Citizen Award.

### **Forestry Department**

Just a reminder, as always, no cutting of trees, brush, or any vegetation is allowed within 75' of a waterway in the Village without a permit. The purpose of this is to prevent erosion, filter runoff before it goes to the water, maintain a healthy aquatic ecosystem, and preserve the natural beauty of all the shorelines.
