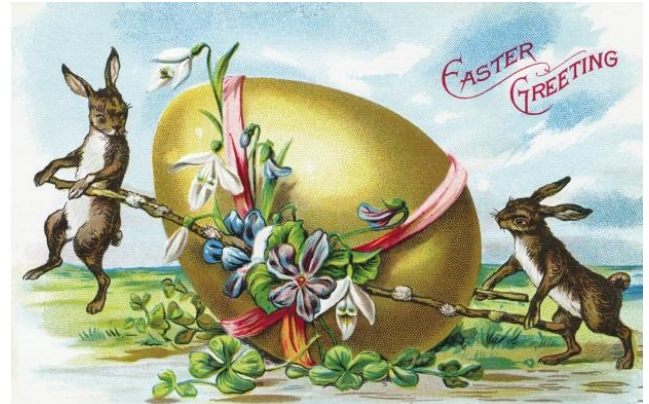
Spring is here!

## Lawn and Fertilization & Buffer Zones



There is absolutely **no fertilizer allowed within 20 feet** of North and Pine Lakes. Lawn fertilizer beyond 20 feet must be phosphorous free. Fertilizing within 20 feet of the lake, in addition to being illegal in the Village, negatively effects the lake. It causes algae and aquatic plant growth. This also reduces water clarity on the lake you and your neighbors live on. With the cooperation of all lake residents, we can assure a better tomorrow on the lake.

## Forestry News



If there is any Oak/Elm pruning you wish to do on your property, **please make sure it is completed by April 15th** to minimize the risk of Oak Wilt and Dutch Elm disease. A good rule of thumb is don't prune Oaks and Elms between April 15<sup>th</sup> and October 15<sup>th</sup>. If you must prune between these dates, you must seal the wound with pruning seal immediately to help prevent infection of these lethal tree diseases.

Also, as the ground thaws and the days get longer, tree buds will start to slowly open up and trees will come out of dormancy. If you have any newly planted trees from the last few years, now is the time to begin watering, especially if we do not get enough spring rain. It is essential that new trees get between 1” and 2” of water each week for the first few years until the roots get established.

## Reminder for Everyone



The weather is starting to get nice and the activity on the lake is picking up, but the water temperature is still very cold. If you plan on enjoying your kayak or paddle board during the spring season, please remember to wear your PFD.

Because the water temperatures are so cold, should you suddenly find yourself in the water, your body could experience shock and hypothermia quickly. Wearing a life jacket, significantly increases the chance of survival.
