Nighttime railroad work to take place in Pewaukee, Nashotah, Oconomowoc, Watertown

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – Canadian Pacific Kansas City Railway crews will work overnights replacing ties on the rail corridor parallel to Wisconsin State Highway 16 starting Monday, April 20. Residents in Pewaukee, Nashotah, Oconomowoc, Ixonia, Watertown, and surrounding areas should expect extra noise and lights until work is completed, likely in mid-June.

Crews will use mechanized track machinery to replace ties that are approaching the ends of their useful service lives from 5 p.m. until 3 a.m. Monday-Thursday nights, finishing for the week early on Fridays. The work supports safe train operations on CPKC's busy Twin Cities-Chicago rail corridor. Nighttime work is necessary to avoid delaying Amtrak's Borealis and Empire Builder services, which use the CPKC line, in addition to minimizing freight disruptions. Work will begin at Pewaukee and progress westward, finishing in Watertown over the course of 6-8 weeks.

CPKC engineering personnel will coordinate crossing removals with local road authorities and private crossing owners. All crossings will be removed and reinstalled, which should improve road surface conditions.
