Voting By Absentee Ballot in Person at the Village Hall has started!

The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office was Tuesday, July 28, 2026.

The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is 5 pm Friday, August 7, 2026.

The Village of Chenequa's hours are Monday – Thursday 8am -4:30pm and on Friday, August 7th, 8am – 5pm.

Partisan Primary – Election Day is Tuesday, August 11, 2026.

Changes in the Village

At our Village Board meeting in July, the following Resolution and Ordinance were passed:

Resolution No. 2026-07-13-02 – Resolution Regarding Change in Snowplow Fee.

Effective with the 2026-2027 winter plowing season, the annual fee has increased from \$200 per household to \$250 per household.

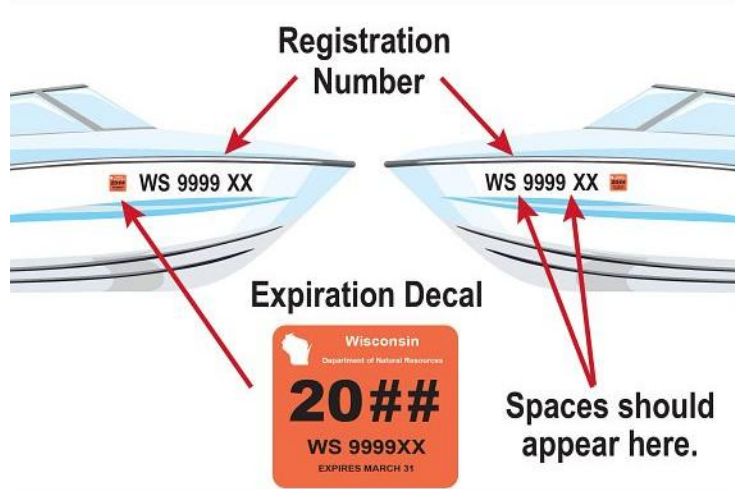
Ordinance No. 2026-07-13-02 – Ordinance Regarding Boat Speeds on Pine Lake.

Boating Reminders

Reminder for everyone: all powered boats operating on any public waterway in the State of Wisconsin must have a Wisconsin Certificate Number (registration) and expiration decals to operate a recreational vessel legally. The Certificate of Number (registration card) must be on board and available for inspection by an enforcement officer whenever the vessel is operated.

DISPLAY OF EXPIRATION DECALS



The registration number and expiration decals must be displayed as follows:

- Numbers must be placed on each side of the forward half of the boat.
- Number must be read from left to right.
- Numbers must be at least 3" high BLOCK letters.
- Numbers must contrast with the color of the boat and be clearly visible and legible.
- Letters must be separated from the numbers by a space at least 2 inches wide.
- Two-tones and camouflage numbers are not legal and should not be used.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their Municipal Clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, and who has resided in the ward or municipality where they wish to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered to vote in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.

TO OBTAIN AN ABSENTEE BALLOT BY MAIL

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may make written application to your Municipal Clerk for an absentee ballot by mail, by fax, by email or at MyVote.wi.gov. Or you may apply in person at the Clerk's Office during the In-Person Absentee Voting period listed below.

Your written request must include:

1. your voting address within the Municipality where you wish to vote;
2. the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different from the address above;
3. your signature; and
4. a copy of your photo identification.

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is 5:00 p.m. on the fifth day before the election: August 11, 2026.

Voters who are indefinitely confined due to age, illness, infirmity, or disability may not be required to provide photo ID. If this applies to you, contact the Municipal Clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the Municipal Clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

VOTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT IN PERSON

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the Clerk's Office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

The deadline for making application to vote absentee by mail is:
5 pm on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, August 6, 2026.

The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is:
Tuesday, July 28, 2026.

The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is:
5 pm on the Friday before the election, Friday, August 7, 2026.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the Election. The Municipal Clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on August 11, 2026. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.
